3. Rarity Tiers and Drop Odds

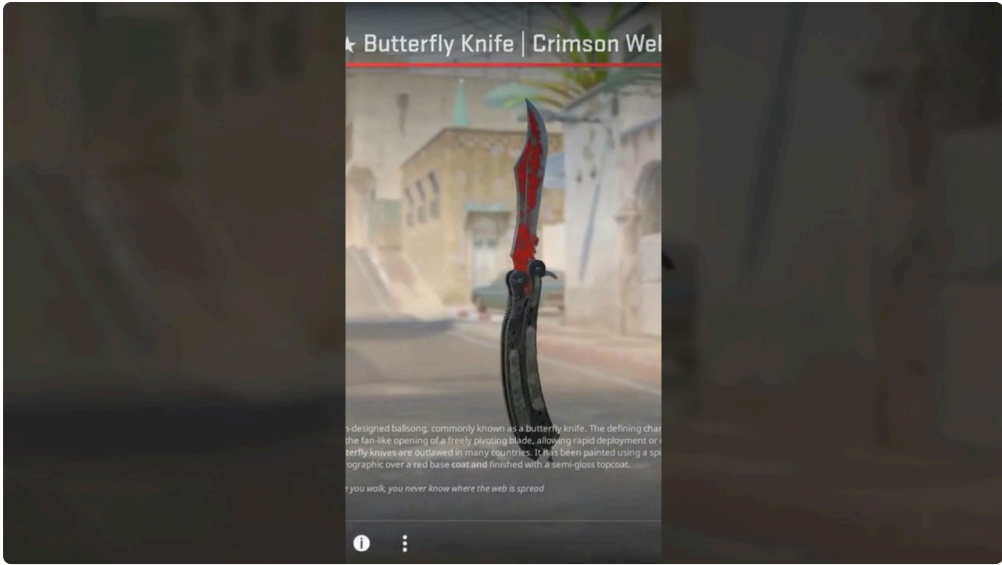
Each case contains five rarity tiers, each with an appointed probability. The following table shows the approximate drop possibilities for a basic case such as the **Chroma Case**.

Rarity Tier (Colour)	Example Skins	Approximate Drop Chance
Mil-Spec (Blue)	Pistols, SMGs	79.92%
Restricted (Purple)	Assault rifles, shotguns	15.98%
Classified (Pink)	Rifles, submachine guns	3.20%
Covert (Red)	High-tier rifles	0.80%
Rare Special Item (Gold)	knives, gloves	0.10%

Note: The exact percentages can vary slightly from one case to another, but the hierarchy remains constant.

4. Popular Cases and Their Market Values
