

A roof does far more than keep rain out. It manages water, sheds debris, buffers wind, supports attic ventilation, and protects the framing, insulation, drywall, and finishes below it. When any part of that system starts to fail, the damage often spreads quietly. A small leak near a chimney flashing can stain a ceiling weeks later. A loose shingle after a thunderstorm can expose underlayment long before a homeowner notices anything from the yard.

Roofs need attention over time, especially in a climate that brings summer heat, heavy rain, hail pockets, and the occasional severe wind event. What home protection really means at the roofline

A protective roof system works as layers. The visible shingle or metal surface is the first shield. Beneath it, underlayment provides another level of defense. Siding and roofing often fail together at transition points
