

A faulty garage door can compromise security, parking, weather protection, and daily routines. Los Angeles homes commonly have one- and two-car attached garages. Local conditions also play a role. What does garage door repair usually include?

Garage door repair generally includes identifying and fixing problems with the door, its working parts, or its automatic operating system. A technician may inspect an overhead garage door for balance, alignment, noise, safety issues, and visible damage before recommending work.

Frequently requested services include repairing or replacing **garage door tracks**, rollers, hinges, brackets, cables, and springs. Tracks must remain in the right position so the door can move smoothly. A **torsion spring** is mounted above the door and uses controlled twisting force to balance the door. Torsion spring replacement is common on modern residential doors and generally provides stable, controlled operation when correctly sized. An **extension-style spring** stretches along the horizontal tracks and may be found on older installations. Extension spring replacement requires proper safety cables and cautious handling.
