- **Prize:** Multiple players deposit skins into a main pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the greatest statistical chance of winning the entire swimming pool, though low-tier contributors can still win.

- **API Restrictions:** Restrictions on how third-party services communicate with user inventories have actually made unauthorized industrial operations harder to preserve.
