- **The Martingale System:** A timeless betting technique where a player doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus a revenue equivalent to the original base bet. Nevertheless, this requires a huge bankroll and can rapidly strike site wagering limitations.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* rather than a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses reduced to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intention of holding out for enormous multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This functions similar to playing the lotto.
