

Storm season has a way of exposing every weak point a roof has been hiding. A shingle that looked fine from the driveway can be loose after one hard gust. Flashing that sealed properly for years can lift just enough to let water travel behind walls and into insulation. In Concord, where thunderstorms, hail, and high winds can move through fast and hit unevenly from one neighborhood to the next, storm damage is rarely as simple as a few missing shingles.

That is why storm damage roof repair Concord NC homeowners depend on has to start with accuracy, not guesswork. ## **What a professional inspection should actually include**
