

A roof rarely fails all at once. Most of the time, it gives fair warning. Shingles start to curl at the edges. Granules collect in the gutters. A patch that once looked harmless grows wider after a summer of heat and a few hard storms. Then one windy afternoon, a section lifts, tabs break loose, and suddenly what looked like routine aging becomes a leak over the hallway or water staining on the ceiling near a vent stack.
