What NOT to Put in a 19-Litre Tank

To make sure animal welfare, prevent keeping the following types in a 5-gallon aquarium:

- **Goldfish:** Goldfish produce enormous amounts of waste and grow far too big. They require a minimum of 75+ litres for a single expensive goldfish.
- **Tetras, Danios, or Barbs:** These are education fish. To be delighted, they need to be kept in groups of six or more and need horizontal swimming space (a minimum of a 38-litre/ 10-gallon tank).
- **Plecostomus (Plecos):** Even the smaller sized species (like the Bristlenose Pleco) outgrow a 19-litre tank quickly.

4. Essential Equipment for a 19-Litre Tank

Setting up an 18.9-litre aquarium requires specific equipment reduced to nano percentages.
