1. Crash

3. CoinFlip

CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) video game mode. Two players wager skins of approximately equal monetary value. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the entire pot, minus a small commission (house edge) taken by the site.

4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, several gamers toss skins into a main pot. Each skin adds to the gamer's general percentage possibility of winning the entire pot (based on the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner picks a winning ticket, and one fortunate player takes home all the transferred skins.
