For example, is the quote based on supply-only or supply and installation? Are concrete footings included? What regarding post caps, crushed rock boards, equipment for entrances, and installation of joints and latches? Some quotes consist of "basic" equipment, others include an updated set without mentioning it. If you require a self-closing system, a lockable latch, or specific gate clearances, you need that in writing.

A solid fence specialist will gladly clarify what's included and will certainly flag exemptions ahead of time, rather than leaving you to uncover them after the very first day on website. If they won't clear up, that's a sign you'll be working out as the work progresses.

2) What sort of fencing is best for my website, and why?

4) What post size, spacing, and footing approach will you use?
