

Local search has become less forgiving, not more. A few years ago, a business could clean up its listings, gather some reviews, publish a few location pages, and see steady traction. That still matters, but the field is more crowded now, and Google is better at interpreting relationships between businesses, services, places, categories, and reputation signals. What changed is not just the interface, it is the underlying understanding of entities.
