If the carrier cannot safely reach the requested address, the provider may coordinate a nearby accessible location. Customers should discuss this possibility when arranging transportation.

Terminal-to-Terminal Transportation

Terminal-to-terminal service involves dropping off and collecting the vehicle at designated transportation facilities or locations. This option can be useful for customers who prefer to handle transportation to and from the terminal themselves.

Before choosing this option, ask about terminal locations, operating hours, storage policies, pickup procedures, and potential fees. Availability can vary by route and provider.
