

Milton is the kind of South Sound city that rewards people who slow down. It sits in that narrow, interesting space between Tacoma and Federal Way, close enough to major roads that you can get where you need to go quickly, but small enough to keep a neighborhood feel. On a clear morning, the light can make even an ordinary street look intentional, and on a rainy afternoon, the evergreen backdrop does a lot of the design work for it.
