- **Coinflip:** A basic 1v1 game where 2 players wager approximately equivalent skin values. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes all.

- **Jackpot:** Multiple players pool their skins into a main pot. A timer counts down, and a random ticket is drawn. The higher the value of the skins a gamer contributes, the greater their analytical chance of winning the pot.
- **Plinko:** Inspired by the game program, players drop a puck down a pegboard, landing in multipliers that either boost or decrease their initial bet.

Comparing Traditional Casinos vs. CS2 Gambling Sites

While both forms of home entertainment include betting, CS2 platforms operate under a significantly different community than conventional online casinos.

4. **The Outcome:** The combination of the server seed, client seed, and nonce is run through an algorithm to produce the game outcome. After the round, the unencrypted server seed is exposed, allowing the player to individually confirm that the result was not modified mid-game.
