- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** 79.923%
- **Restricted (Purple):** 15.985%
- **Classified (Pink):** 3.2%
- **Covert (Red):** 0.64%
- **Rare Special Item (Knives/ Gloves):** 0.26%

To put that into perspective, the odds of unpacking a rare knife or set of gloves are roughly **1 in 385**. Since of these high odds, the mathematical expected worth (EV) of opening a case is generally lower than the cost of the secret and the case integrated.
