1. CSGOEmpire

CSGOEmpire is the leader of CS: GO case battles, providing both "Classic" and "Battle" modes. - Slower withdrawal times.
- Rakeback not as generous.

5. Skinbay

Skinbay is a more recent entrant that concentrates on skin-to-cash conversions. It offers a modest 25% welcome bonus however masters withdrawal speed-- most payouts are completed within 24 hours.
