

How Much Does a 2-Car Garage Door Replacement Cost?

The usual **2 car garage door replacement cost** near Los Angeles often falls between **\$1,200 and \$4,500** for the door and regular installation. A standard, non-insulated steel **overhead garage door** may be near the bottom of the range, while an insulated, custom, designer, or wood door can cost considerably more.
