Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

If you are experiencing recurring crashes, work through the following troubleshooting actions systematically.

1. Confirm the Integrity of Game Files

In time, game files can become damaged [CS2 Skin](#) due to unforeseen system shutdowns, incomplete updates, or malfunctioning storage drives. Steam has an integrated tool to check and replace missing or broken files.

- Open the **Steam Library**.
- Right-click on **CS: GO** and select **Properties**.
- Browse to the **Local Files** tab.
- Click **Verify Integrity of Game Files**.
- Await the process to finish (Steam will automatically download any damaged files), then restart your computer.

2. Update or Roll Back Graphics Drivers

- **NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or visit the main NVIDIA site to download the current Game Ready Driver.

3. Change Launch Options

- Discord Overlay
- NVIDIA GeForce Experience Overlay
- RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS) and MSI Afterburner

1. Handling Overclocks and XMP Profiles

2. Re-installing CS: GO Cleanly

- Uninstall CS: GO through Steam.
