5. Can I get VAC banned for using case battle sites?

Using third-party trading and case-opening sites does not straight result in a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. However, Valve periodically updates its terms of service or prohibits API secrets connected with automatic trading bots, which can temporarily interrupt your ability to trade skins.
