

Garage Door Repair Near Me in Los Angeles

Broken Springs, Cables, and Rollers

A broken garage door spring is one of the most serious repair issues. The spring balances the weight of the door, allowing the opener and homeowner to lift it safely. A failed **torsion spring** is positioned above the door, while an **extension spring** is typically positioned along the horizontal tracks. Both types are under significant tension and should only be adjusted or replaced by a trained professional.

Garage Door Opener and Remote Problems
