When I flip the query and ask what has dissatisfied them, they resolution with identical care, record unkept can provide, botched wars, systemic harms, and leaders who diminished the bar. The level isn't to stability the ledger however to refuse the inspiration that love of usa requires pretending the ledger does now not exist.

If you fairly trust america is able to development, then your pleasure is usually each provide annoying and conditional. Not pleasure that waits for perfection, and not pleasure that excuses every thing. Pride that claims, we developed a resilient framework, more often than not stretched it, on occasion broke it, and will recommit to fixing what we bend. No flag needs to worry that sentence.
