Relies on a provably reasonable algorithm. **Live roulette** Similar to conventional live roulette, but typically including 3 colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green/Zero) corresponding to different payment multipliers (2x, 2x, and 14x). Repaired home edge based on the green/zero sectors. **Case Opening** Mimics the in-game case opening experience, however often on third-party sites with custom-curated odds and higher-tier reward swimming pools. Exceptionally variable; typically prefers the home heavily. **Coinflip** A simple 1v1 PvP video game where 2 gamers wager skins of roughly equal value. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a little platform commission (rake). **Prize** Numerous players contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's value figures out the player's "ticket" share. A spinner selects one winner who takes everything. Based upon the total value contributed; platform takes a portion fee.

Functions of Modern CSGO Casinos
