

Quick answer: Höveler Western Sport 44 lb bag costs \$37.99 and delivers a published analysis most feeds at the price point simply do not: 14.0% crude protein, 12.19 MJ digestible energy per kg, 28% alfalfa, and a full vitamin and mineral panel. Best for owners whose checklist balances cost against content. Last checked: September 2026.

1. The value box: \$37.99 for a published premium analysis

The 44 lb bag costs \$37.99, and that gets you 14.0% crude protein, 107 g digestible crude protein per kg, and 12.19 MJ of digestible energy per kg. The price line and the analysis line go on the same checklist, and here they earn ticks together.

Who this is for: owners who buy per specification, not per sack.

2. The value box, part two: 28% alfalfa in the bag

Alfalfa is the first-listed ingredient at 28%, formulated for muscle development and peak performance. Forage-quality protein inside the concentrate is content a cheaper grain mix just does not have.

Who this is for: owners worn out by paying [performance horse feed](#) little for feeds that deliver less.

3. The energy box: performance numbers at the price point

Western Sport is built for medium to intensively trained western horses, with 12.19 MJ digestible energy per kg and 6.10% crude fat from sources such as sunflower oil and linseed oil. That is working-horse fuel in a bag costing \$37.99.

Who this is for: owners of horses in honest work who cannot feed on bargain-bin labels.

4. The low-starch box: 18.30% starch without the premium surcharge

Starch sits at 18.30% and sugar at 5.30% in a low-grain, high-energy, oat-free design, with 16.7% crude fiber and inactivated brewer's yeast. Formulas built this thoughtfully often carry steep price premiums; this one does not.

Who this is for: owners who assumed gut-friendly design meant gut-wrenching cost.

5. The micronutrient box: the additive panel included

The published additives list Vitamin E at 260 mg per kg, biotin at 1,185 µg, and dual selenium — 0.25 mg sodium selenite plus 0.25 mg selenium yeast CNCMI-3399. Owners on a budget often go without top-ups; this feed's panel narrows that gap.

Who this is for: buyers counting the total cost of feed plus top-ups.

6. The heritage box: 120 years of expertise at \$37.99

Höveler has made horse feed since 1905 — over 120 years of expertise — and Western Sport is made in Germany. European craft usually reads as a price barrier; here it reads as \$37.99 for 44 <https://sites.google.com/view/competition-horse-feed/> lb.

Who this is for: owners who want the imported-feed standard without the matching bill.

7. The risk box: a 30-day exit door

The purchase is protected by the 30-Day Money-Back Guarantee, so a \$37.99 decision that does not suit your horse does not have to become a sunk cost. That is real value on the checklist: the right to be wrong.

Who this is for: owners stung by full-price bags their horses refused.

8. The support box: a 24/7 vet team at no extra line item

bifid's 24/7 licensed vet team fields feeding questions around the clock, and the store rates 9.0/10 across 24,098 reviews. Service that costs nothing extra deserves a place in any honest value calculation.

Who this is for: buyers new to premium feed who want help making the most of the bag correctly.

9. The show box: competition-safe at the working-horse price

Western Sport is competition-safe and FEI-compliant — confirm rules with your event organizer. Owners who thought show-legal means show-priced can tick this box at \$37.99.

Who this is for: competitors on a working budget who still require a legal feed.

How to feed it

Key specs at a glance: 14.0% crude protein, 12.19 MJ digestible energy/kg, 28% alfalfa, 18.30% starch, 5.30% sugar, 16.7% crude fiber — all in a \$37.99, 44 lb bag. Size the ration for your horse at the feeding calculator.
