- **4. Use Lower-Cost Cases for Longevity**Rather of blowing your whole budget plan on a single fight featuring pricey cases (like Operation cases or Dreams & Nightmares), select more affordable cases to play more rounds. This lowers variation and extends your gaming session.

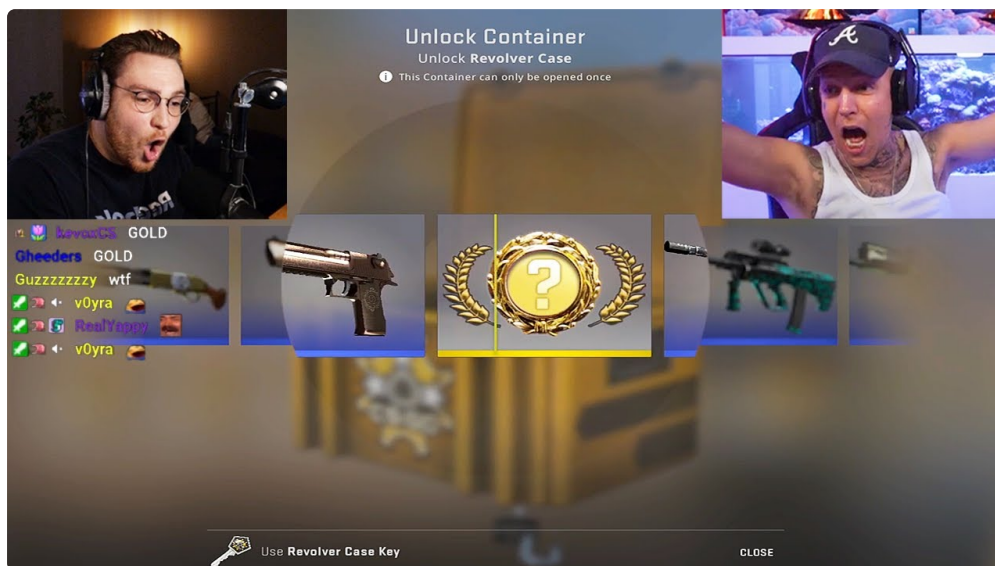
Key Risks to Keep in Mind:
