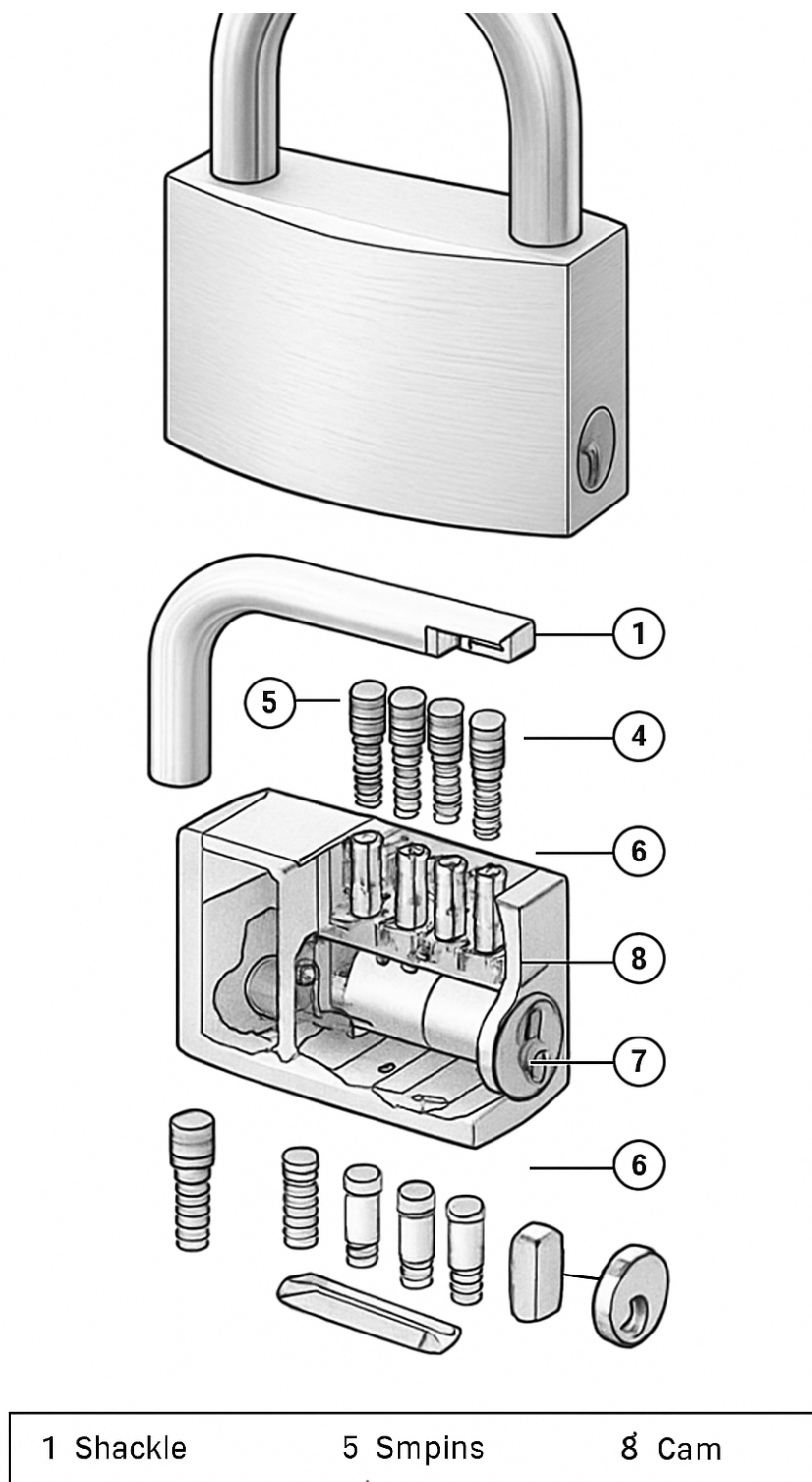
Business entry is about more than opening a door
