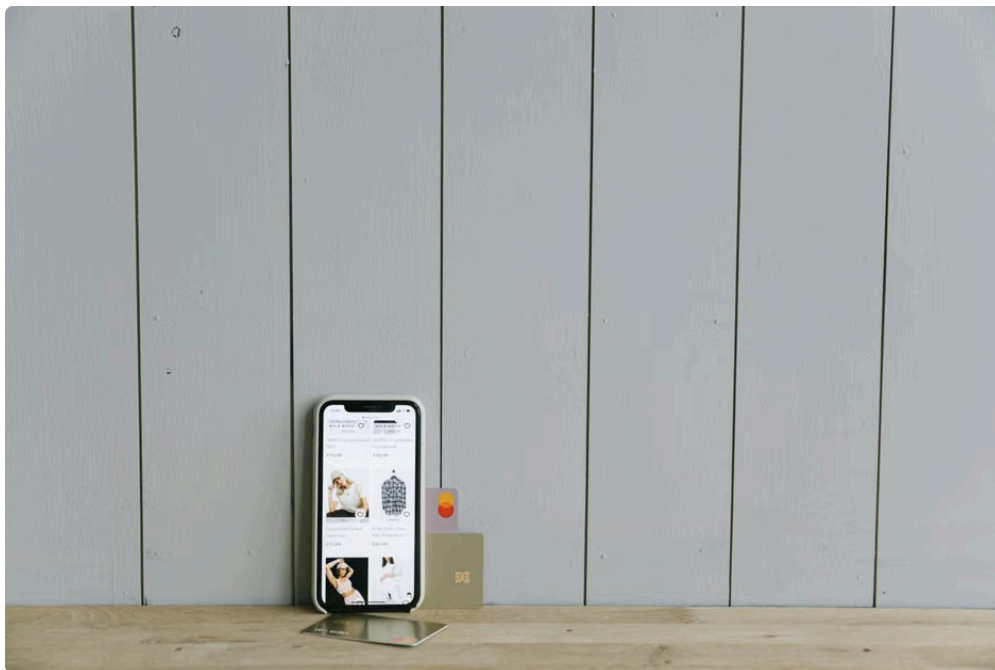
4. Fast Game Discovery: Search, Filters, and Categories
