

Why Regular Garage Door Safety Evaluations Are Important

A garage door is often the biggest moving object in a Los Angeles home. A skilled **garage door safety inspection** can detect weakened components before a failure leads to an injury, property damage, or an unexpected access problem. A regularly maintained **overhead garage door** should operate seamlessly, remain properly balanced, and function as intended to its controls.

- **Garage door springs:** Look for visible corrosion, gaps, deformation, or a spring that appears loose or stretched. Do not handle, adjust, or remove a spring.
- **Garage door cables:** Check for wear, kinks, broken strands, slack, or cables that have slipped from their drums. Damaged cables require professional attention.

- **Door sections and hardware:** Inspect hinges, brackets, weather seals, and panels for cracks, corrosion, or separating joints.
- **Opener operation:** Listen for grinding, popping, or straining and observe whether the door stops at the proper open and closed positions.

Salt air, dust, heat, and ordinary daily use can shorten the life of hardware. Include lubrication and fastener checks in your **garage maintenance** plan, but use only products intended for garage door components. Lubrication will not correct a bent track, failing spring, or loose structural bracket.

Check the Door Balance and Manual Release

A **door balance test** indicates whether the spring system is carrying the door's weight correctly. Close the door fully, disconnect the opener using the **manual release cord**, and carefully lift the door by hand only if the door is

operating normally and no cables or springs appear damaged. A balanced door should move easily and remain near the halfway position without rapidly dropping or lifting.

If the door is particularly heavy, drops, sticks, or will not stay in place, reconnecting and repeatedly activating the opener can cause more damage. A **torsion spring**, typically installed above the door, stores considerable energy. **Extension springs**, usually positioned along the horizontal tracks, also contain unsafe stored force. Spring adjustment, removal, and replacement should be performed by a trained professional.

Test the emergency release cord only when the door is closed unless a technician has advised otherwise. The release lets you operate the door manually during a power outage or opener failure. Make sure the cord is within reach but out of reach of young children. Never use the manual release to bypass a door that has a broken spring, loose cable, or structural damage.

Check Photo-Eye Sensors, Auto-Reverse, and Controls

Most automatic systems use **photo-eye sensors** mounted near the floor on each side of the opening. They should be aimed at one another, remain firmly attached, and have clear lenses. Dust, cobwebs, accidental impacts, or misalignment can prevent the door from closing correctly.

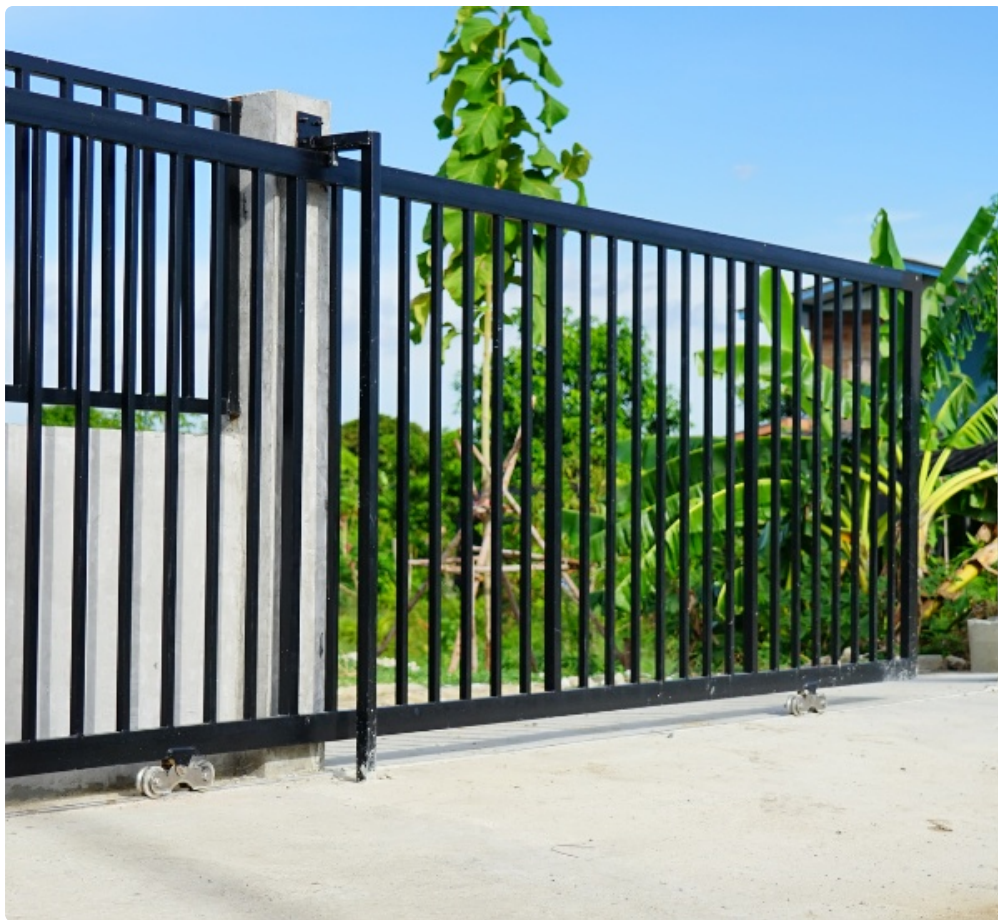
