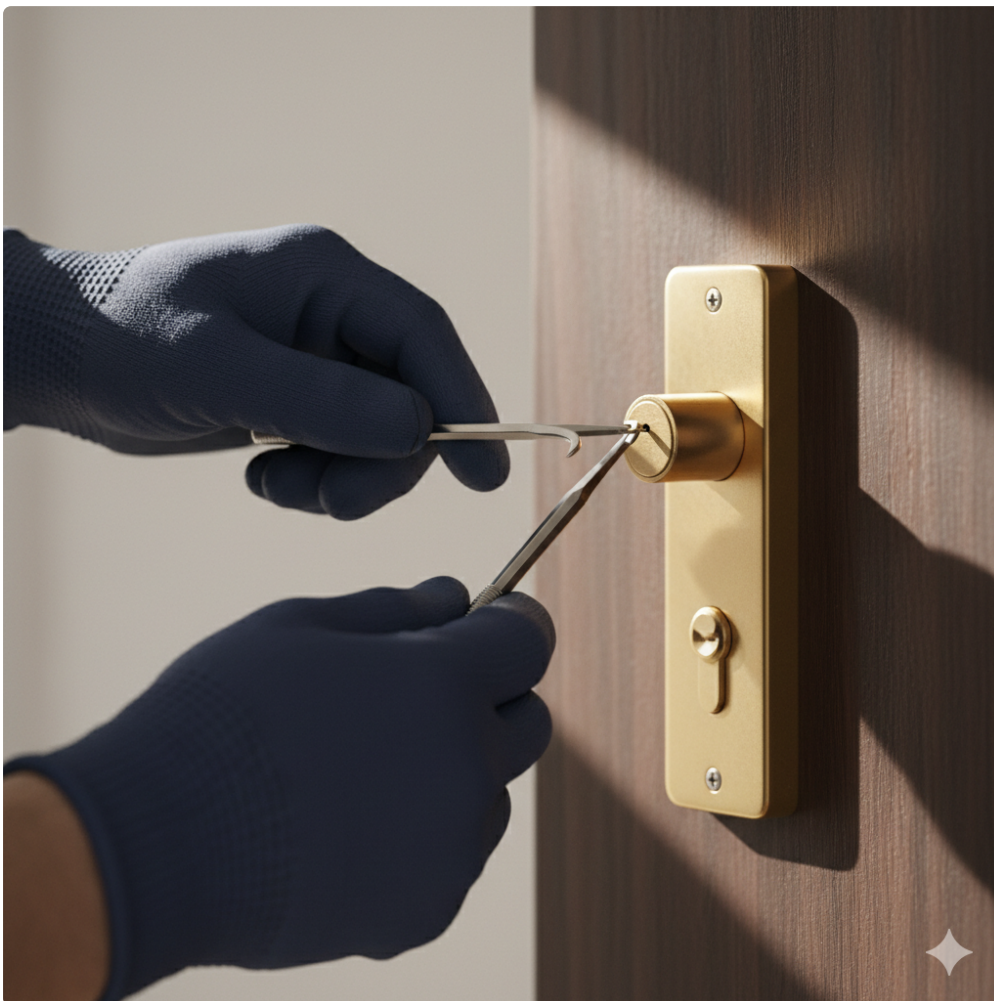
Licensing, trust, and what to ask first
