(Note: These percentages use to the base item tier. If a product drops, there is an additional 10% chance that it will feature StatTrak technology, which minimizes the base chances of getting a particular item variant even further.)

To put these numbers into viewpoint, the possibility of unboxing a rare, high-tier Knife or pair of Gloves is approximately **1 in 385**.

Comprehending Float Values and Conditions

Even if a player beats the chances and lands a high-tier product, the battle is only half won. Every weapon dropped from a case is designated a **Float Value**-- a number in between 0.00 and 1.00 that determines the wear condition of the skin.

The wear conditions are categorized as follows:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very Little Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.37
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.37-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Different skins have different wear limits. Some skins can not be acquired in Factory New condition, suggesting the top-tier float values are incredibly unusual and command massive costs on the Steam Community Market.



Why Do Players Keep Opening Cases?

With such overwhelming odds, why is the case-opening economy worth billions of dollars? The psychology behind CS: GO case odds relies greatly on cognitive biases.

- **The Near-Miss Effect:** Watching the cursor gradually tick past a Gold product and land on an inexpensive Blue product activates the exact same psychological reaction in the brain as a win, encouraging another effort.
- **Variable Reward Schedules:** Much like a fruit machine, the unpredictability of the benefit keeps players engaged. You never know *when* the payout will occur, only that it *might* occur on the next try.
- **The Investment Illusion:** Some players see case opening as a financial investment, intending to pull a rare item that will value in worth in time.

However, stats prove that the "House" often wins in the long run. The Expected Value (EV) of opening a case is practically generally lower than the combined expense of the case and the secret.
