Start with the right context, not the fanciest portfolio

As you browse, try to filter their work into "same circumstance" and "various situation." Very same scenario tasks are the ones you need to stress over. Various situation jobs can still notify you, however you'll consider them differently.

What to request for when you ask for past work

Photos are the beginning factor, not the destination. If a specialist is severe about high quality, they will be comfortable sharing details that surpass marketing pictures, and they need to have the ability to discuss exactly how their choices attach to performance.

Good evidence includes images with regular angles and clear sights of the fencing from several ranges, particularly close-ups at the posts, entrance joints, latch factors, and areas where fencing satisfies existing frameworks. If you can, demand at the very least one of each:

- a project similar to your own (materials and design),
- a job that shows entrances and equipment,
- and a job that's been weathering for at the very least a number of seasons.

Two to three years is a meaningful home window for outside materials, however even more recent work can be interesting if the installation details look right and the specialist discusses their method clearly.

Posts are the foundation, and they inform the truth

Straight lines matter, however stable equipment matters more

In a portfolio, focus on images that reveal:

Judge craftsmanship and team consistency, not simply the final product
