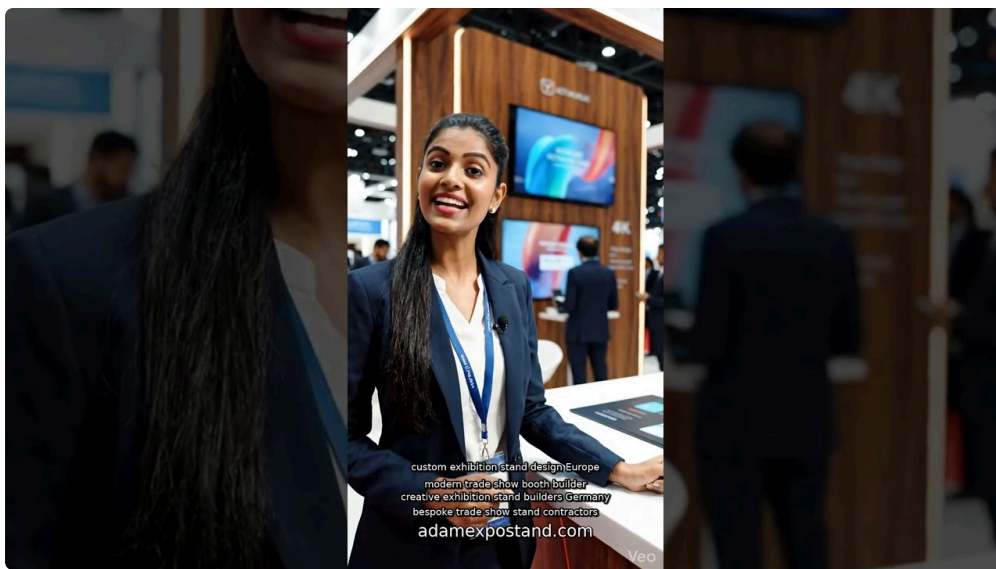


Focus on Quality Over Quantity
