

Elm Grove has a way of revealing itself slowly. At first glance, it can look like the kind of Milwaukee-area village people simply pass through on their way elsewhere. Spend a little time here, though, and the details start to matter. The tree-lined streets feel intentional. The homes have character. The civic spaces are compact but well used. You get the sense that this is a place where people notice when a storefront changes hands, where the same families show up year after year at school events, and where the village's older corners still carry the memory of how the community grew.
