Winner takes all (minus a website commission). 50/50 odds, based on a platform rake (cost). **Prize** Numerous gamers contribute skins to a typical swimming pool. The greater the worth contributed, the greater the opportunity of winning the entire pot. Probability-based based upon relative skin worth.

- **Consumer Support:** Reliable 24/7 live chat assistance is necessary for fixing deposit failures, trade hold problems, or account questions immediately.
