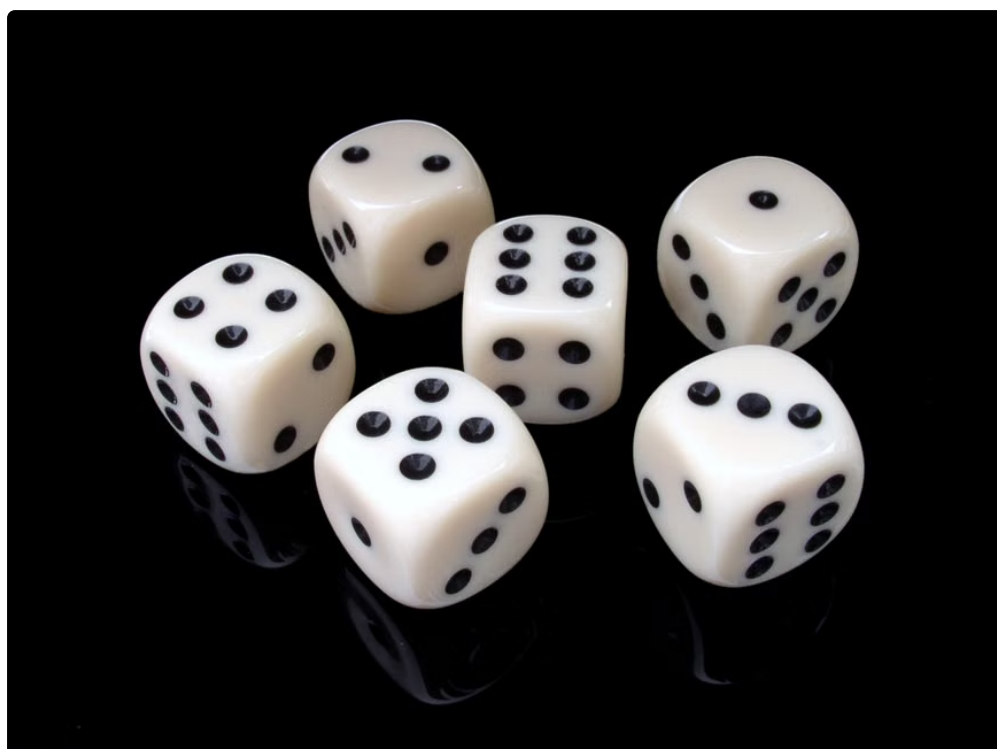
- They act as regular wilds, substituting for other symbols to complete winning paylines.

- However, their 'expansion' increases the number of wilds available on that reel, often enhancing your chances for a winning combination.

Important: This sounds enticing, but it's crucial to remember that this behavior is 100% random based on the game's programming and independent spins. No amount of strategy or pattern observation changes the odds that the expanding wild will appear or how it will expand.

Example of Expanding Wild Behavior

Say you're playing a 5x3 slot on the BingoPlus platform. You spin the reels and the expanding wild lands on reel 3 in row 2. Instantly, it expands upward and downward in that reel to cover positions 1, 2, and 3 in reel 3, turning those symbols into wilds for that spin. This increases your chances of forming winning combinations involving reel 3.



Yet, the key takeaway is that this entire event is random. The expanding wild could have landed in row 1, expanding to three rows vertically; or not appear at all on your next spin.

Common Misconceptions and the Gambler's Fallacy

One of the most frequent misunderstandings players have is that expanding wilds follow predictable cycles or patterns. This ties into the **gambler's fallacy**, where players expect past outcomes to influence future results, for example:

- "I haven't seen expanding wilds for 10 spins, so my next spin must have one."
- "Two spins with expanding wilds in a row mean I won't see them again soon."

Remember, each spin is an **independent event**. Outcome randomization ensures that past spins do not impact future spins on well-designed slots as featured in BingoPlus collections. The expanding wild could show up several times in a row or not for dozens of spins — all due to chance.

Avoid Chasing Patterns
