- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look unbelievable even at greater wear values, while others look heavily damaged. Understanding how float values impact price is vital if you plan to trade or sell your unboxed items.



3. Think About Buying Directly

If there is a specific skin you frantically want, the most affordable route is usually buying it directly off the Steam Market or a relied on third-party market, rather than trying to gamble for it through case openings.
