Gamers must choose one of three flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The wheel spins, and whichever multiplier the chosen flapper points to is awarded. If it lands on "Double" or "Triple," all multipliers on the wheel boost, and the wheel spins once again approximately an optimum of 20,000 x.
