- **Sticker labels and Nametags:** Players can apply commemorative sticker labels or rename their weapons to further personalize them.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An unique variant of a skin that features a physical LED counter on the weapon, tracking the number of verified kills made by the owner.

The Five Exterior Wear Conditions

The condition of a skin dramatically affects its visual appeal and market value. Valve classifies floats into 5 distinct tiers:

Wear Condition	Float Range	Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with little to no noticeable wear. Frequently the most pricey tier.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Minor signs of wear, typically visible just on close examination or particular high-friction locations.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Noticeable scratches and wear on the body and paintwork. The most common market tier.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Greatly distressed, rusted, or scraped. Some skins look completely various (and distinctively gritty) in this condition.

Loadouts in CS2 are categorized by weapon types, with gamers typically choosing a main rifle (AK-47 for Terrorists, M4A4 or M4A1-S for Counter-Terrorists), a sniper rifle (AWP), and sidearms.

The CS2 Economy: More Than Just Pixels

What started as a basic personalization feature has actually evolved into a multi-billion-dollar virtual economy. CS2 skins have real-world financial worth, driven by supply and demand, rarity, and community sentiment.

Unlike traditional video games where in-game purchases are locked to a single account, Valve allows peer-to-peer trading and marketplace transactions. This has turned the CS2 economy into a decentralized monetary community looking like conventional stock exchange or crypto exchanges.



Key Factors Driving Skin Prices

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Skins are classified by rarity tiers, varying from Consumer Grade (White) to Covert (Red), with Special Rare items (Knives and Gloves) having the lowest drop rates from cases.
2. **Trade-Up Contracts:** Players can trade ten skins of a specific tier for one skin of the next greater tier, burning supply while doing so and modifying market characteristics.
3. **Pro Player Influence:** When an expert esports gamer uses a particular skin throughout a major tournament, the need-- and subsequently the price-- for that skin often surges over night.
4. **Case Availability:** As cases end up being older, they drop less frequently, increasing the rate of both the case and the coveted skins inside them.
