

A malfunctioning overhead garage door can disrupt residential safety, daily schedules, and vehicle entry. Los Angeles homeowners may also experience factors that increase damage: intense sunshine and heat can cause fading, cracking, and weather-seal damage, particularly on south- or west-facing garage doors.
