

The very first time I assisted a next-door neighbor set up a lawn sprinkler system, we allotted one weekend. We finished on the third, sore, sunburnt, and a little humbled. The system worked, although we invested the next month dialing in head positioning, taking care of tiny leaks, and discovering why water stress theoretically does not constantly match what comes out of a trench line after 8 tees and a rise in grade. That experience taught me a truth I have actually seen time and again: when it comes to sprinkler installment, layout decisions made on day one echo for several years, in water costs, in plant health and wellness, and in just how often you discover on your own down in the dirt doing lawn sprinkler repair.

This is not a scare piece. A lot of house owners build reliable, durable systems and take satisfaction in the results.
