Numbers flatten horror, yet additionally they withstand amnesia. Around 51,000 males were killed, wounded, captured, or lacking over three days in July 1863. Under the summer time sun, squaddies bled into the rocky soil of Little Round Top, the Peach Orchard, the Wheatfield, the perimeters of Culp's Hill, and throughout the broad plain that swallowed Pickett's Charge. It turned into victory, however the variety that leaves a nation greatly surprised and grey-faced. The men who fought there had been no longer mythic figures. They have been farmers, shopkeepers, immigrants who spoke with thick accents, instructors, youth, and fathers who didn't are living to see the harvest.
