Lockouts at home are usually less dramatic than they feel

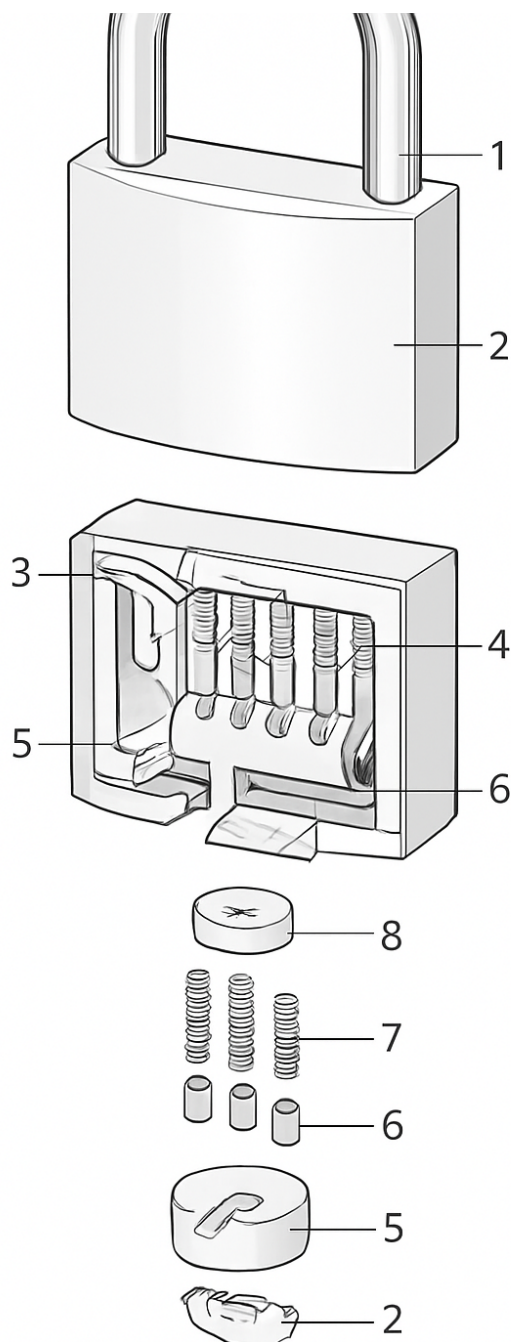
