- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a single pot. The higher the value of a gamer's deposit, the greater their statistical opportunity of winning the whole accumulated pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on expert CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) using virtual balance or skins, predicting match winners, map scores, or particular in-game events.

Note: Due to Steam trade holds (a 7-day trade constraint placed on freshly traded products), withdrawing physical skins can sometimes need waiting a week before the product is tradable once again.
