- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look amazing even at higher wear values, while others look greatly battered. Knowing how float worths impact rate is essential if you plan to trade or sell your unboxed items.

3. Think About Buying Directly

If there is a particular skin you desperately desire, the most economical route is usually buying it directly off the Steam Market or a trusted third-party marketplace, rather than attempting to gamble for it through case openings.
