Device Diversity and Real-Device Testing

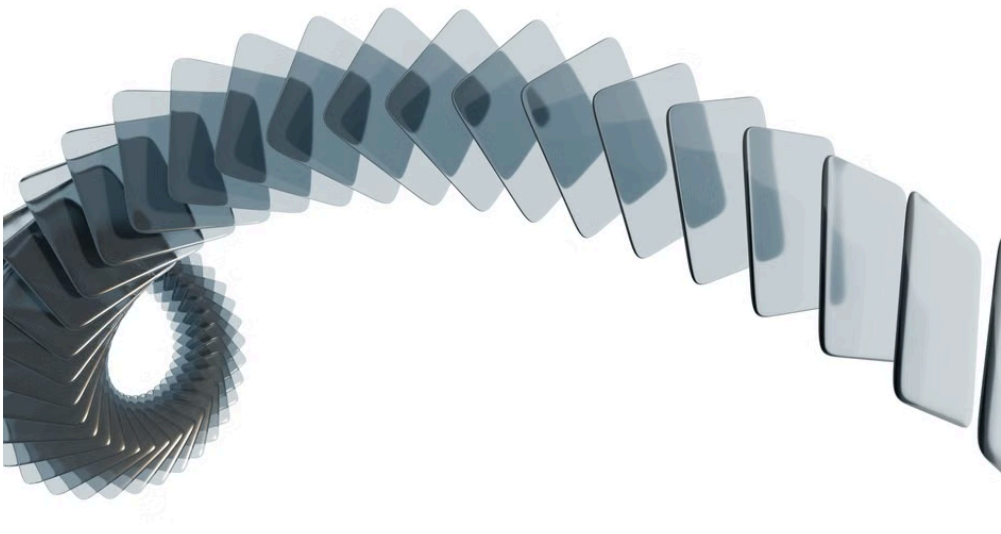
