

What temporary means here

Most outdoor lighting is an installation. Event lighting goes up for an occasion and comes back down. Weddings, parties, celebrations: set up for the date and removed after. That changes everything about how it gets planned, starting with the fact that there is no second chance at it. Which changes the working relationship. An installation is judged over years. An event has one performance. Everything gets settled before the week of, since improvising on the day is how events go wrong.

Why timing dominates

With an installation, the calendar has give. With an event, a delay is a failure. That means planning happens further ahead than the job size suggests. Even a modest setup has the same steps, and none of them compress.

What actually causes problems

Indoor events have outlets. A back yard, a field, a venue lawn rarely has power where the lighting needs to be. Ask about how it is getting powered before the design conversation feels finished. A beautiful plan nobody can energize is not a plan. And whoever is handling the lighting should be told what else is happening in the space, because a band, a caterer and a photographer all have requirements that touch the same square footage.

The contingency conversation

Outdoor events are subject to whatever the day brings. Ask early: what the contingency looks like. Knowing whether the setup can move under cover, whether the date can shift, and who decides is worth more than any fixture choice.

What tends to matter at an event

Two categories: the parts people photograph and the parts people walk on. The photographed parts are the overhead canopy, the head table, the ceremony area, the feature tree. The functional parts are the path from the parking to the venue, the steps, the entrance and the way to the restrooms. Both need to be in the plan. Only one of them gets remembered fondly.

The venue has rules

If the event is not at your own house, the property has its own requirements. When you can get in, what you can touch, and when it all has to come out are not yours to make. Getting those two parties connected up front removes most of the day of problems.

Scale

Planning an event, the temptation is to over specify. Dark surroundings make everything read brighter, so a plan that seems thin in daylight is usually right. Contrast carries the atmosphere. Even brightness does not. A designer who says the plan is already enough is doing you a favor.

What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
