Prices vary based on supply, need, and market patterns on the Steam Community Market (SCM).

How Case Opening Works

- Get a Case and a Key**-- Cases can be made through gameplay (dropped after matches) or bought from the SCM. Keys are bought from the in-game store or from third-party markets.
- Open the Inventory Menu**-- Navigate to the "Cases" tab in the inventory screen.
- Select a Case and a Key**-- Click the case you wish to open, then place a matching key.
- Validate the Action**-- The game displays a brief animation that reveals a random product.
- Get the Item**-- The skin is included to your stock and can be kept, utilized, or offered.

Understanding Drop Odds

Each case follows a predefined possibility distribution. While specific percentages can vary, the normal breakdown for a standard case looks like this:

 Mil-Spec (Blue) ~ 80%
 Restricted (Purple) ~ 15%
 Classified (Pink) ~ 4%
 Covert (Red) ~ 0.8%

Do's and Do n'ts

- **Do** set a strict budget before opening cases. Decide beforehand just how much you're prepared to invest and never ever surpass it.
- **Do** keep the skins you like for personal use instead of focusing entirely on resale.
- **Do** display market trends; specific skins increase in value throughout tournaments or after brand-new case releases.
- **Don't** chase losses by acquiring more keys in hopes of "winning back" money.
- **Don't** deal with case opening as a financial investment technique; the odds are not in your favour.

Tips for Maximising Value

- **Buy cases when they're low-cost**-- Newer cases tend to be economical at launch, then rise as the supply diminishes.
- **Use trade-up agreements**-- By integrating lower-tier skins, you can potentially acquire a higher-tier skin at a minimized expense.
- **Sell instantly after opening**-- If you're not preparing to use the skin, listing it on the SCM right now can lock in present market value before they dip.

Where to Buy, Sell, and Trade

- **Steam Community Market**-- The official platform for purchasing and offering skins. It provides safe transactions however imposes a 15% fee on revenues.
- **Third-Party Marketplaces**-- Sites like Buff.163, Skinport, or DMarket often supply lower fees and faster liquidity, however confirm the platform's credibility to avoid scams.
- **Trade-Up Sites**-- Some communities host "trade-up" services where you can exchange multiple products for a possibility at a rarer skin, normally for a service cost.
