

What Is Included in Garage Door Repair Typically Include?

Garage door repair can cover anything from a minor adjustment to replacing a major mechanical component. A technician may examine an **overhead garage door**, identify the cause of the problem, and evaluate the complete system before suggesting work. If the door opens but the **garage door won't close**, inspect the **garage door safety sensors** near the bottom of each side of the opening. They must face each other and remain free of dirt, obstructions, and damage. Misaligned sensors are common, but a flashing light or repeated reversal can also indicate wiring faults or opener trouble. Never bypass these sensors; they are an important part of garage door safety.
