Wrongdoer networks and carders exploited this liquidity by acquiring keys with stolen credit funds, trading them instantly, and squandering. To combat this, **Valve made all freshly acquired secrets untradeable and unmarketable**.

This single update caused a huge shockwave in the trading neighborhood, permanently separating "investable skins" from "functional keys."

Kinds of Keys in Counter-Strike

Not all keys are produced equal. For many years, Valve presented a number of variations of secrets tied to specific collections or events.

1. Requirement Case Keys

Acquired directly from the in-game store for £ 2.50. These can open the huge bulk of standard weapon cases currently dropping in the game.

2. Operation Keys

Presented early in CS: GO's life-span to help fund prize pools for expert tournaments, Esport keys opened Esport-specific green, blue, and red cases. These are remarkably unusual today.

No. Valve has never put standard case secrets on sale. Their rate has remained locked at £ 2.50 GBP (changed for local currency) for the life time of the game.

5. What takes place to keys if I delete them?

If you delete a key from cs2skin.com your inventory, it is completely ruined. Valve will not bring back deleted products, so exercise extreme caution when managing your stock.
