Secret Milestones in CS: GO Gambling Controversy:

1. **The 2016 Lawsuits:** Class-action lawsuits were submitted versus Valve, accusing the company of assisting in prohibited minor gambling by enabling its API to link to third-party gambling sites.
2. **The Cease-and-Desist Letters:** Valve issued mass warnings to lots of popular gambling sites, demanding they closed down their operations and withdrawing the API access of bots used to move skins.
3. **Regulative Crackdowns:** Countries such as the Netherlands, Belgium, and Australia categorized certain loot box and skin gambling mechanics as forms of illegal gambling, resulting in regional restrictions.
4. **The Crypto Pivot:** Following Valve's technical limitations, many CS: GO gambling establishments rotated to accepting cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) along with skins, running in legal grey areas under overseas licenses (such as Curacao).
