Drop Pools Explained

The case drop pool is divided into 2 unique categories:

*Note: There is also a roughly 10% chance for any weapon skin dropped to be in **StatTrak**™ condition, which tracks eliminates made with that weapon.*

4. Drift Values and Exterior Conditions

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Immaculate, very little scratches)

- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear, scratches)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Heavy damage, often revealing special patinas)

Some skins look nearly similar in Field-Tested as they carry out in Factory New, while others look heavily broken down. Smart traders and collectors pay attention to drift caps when assessing case pulls.
